Call to Order

- The LCOL (Lane Council of Librarians) meet Thursday, January 31 and the Junction Community Center at 2:00 p.m. All were in attendance except the Siuslaw Library. There was discussion around being fine free. Coordinator Darling is going to look into it. A number of libraries are considering it. Creswell library is remodeling and will be done in June. That is where the next meeting will be. Springfield Public Library is trying to put a bond measure on ballot – want to build a new building that will be twice the size of current building. Fern Ridge Public is revamping their circulation desk.

- Seed to Supper – We now have information sheets posted at the library, Local-Aid, Viking Sal Senior center and the Community Service Center. Four people have signed up to attend. There is room for a total of fifteen. Edie Moro works for the local paper and wrote an article about the Seed to Supper program. It will start April 2, a Tuesday from 10 to 12 at the Community Service Center and will run for six weeks.
